#### FRAMLINGHAM COLLEGE: A TALE OF GENEROSITY

The history of Framlingham College is, in many ways, a tale of generosity and kindness. Its origins reflect the gratitude of Queen Victoria for her husband's life, and its continuing existence reflect the impact of fundraising through legacies and donations over the years.

For example, the Senior School sits in 75 acres of land that also encompasses Framlingham Castle, all of which was generously donated by Pembroke College, Cambridge. Our Prep School, nestling in 23 acres of meadowland on the banks of the Deben, was bought by the Society of Old Framlinghamians to remember those who fell in the two World Wars.

Our benefactors continue to support the school through donations and legacies, allowing us to create bursary funds, provide up-to-date equipment and to help finance major building projects. Indeed, the generosity of our benefactors is a vital part of our efforts to ensure that future generations of boys and girls have even better opportunities than their predecessors. To ensure we can meet this aim, we are proud to launch the Framlingham College Legacy Campaign.

#### THE FRAMLINGHAM COLLEGE LEGACY CAMPAIGN

Just as a Will brings security to your family's future, a legacy to Framlingham College will secure the future of the school, providing our pupils with up-to-date equipment and modern facilities, and enabling them to benefit from the best education and care that the public sector has to offer.

A Will is a legally witnessed document which states how you wish your estate, after your death, to be divided up between family, friends and charities. Any donation to charity is exempt from inheritance tax and is defined as a legacy. Your donation will help future pupils, who may also be your grandchildren, enjoy the most up-to-date equipment and surroundings o make their experience of school successful and memorable.

Past legacies have had a huge impact on the school. Recent examples include the 2006 refurbishment of the Athlone Hall, creating the impressive Headmaster Porter Theatre within, and the 2017 refurbishment and extension of the old pavilion to create the outstanding Fowler Pavilion. We already know several people who intend to leave us substantial legacies. They are now members of our prestigious benefactors' club, the 1864 Club, and are actively engaged and interested in the College's work. They are helping shape our future, and you can too.

#### **THE 1864 CLUB**

Framlingham College was founded in 1864 and the aptly named 1864 Club was formed to recognise and thank major benefactors, during their lifetimes, who generously give gifts and/or who indicate that they are leaving a legacy to Framlingham College. It is through such generosity that we can ensure that the College remains at the forefront of education for future generations of Old Framlinghamians. Every donation and every pledge, no matter how large or how small, will make a difference.

Members of the 1864 Club will receive regular communication so that they are updated on how the school is progressing. # You can leave a variety of gifts in your Will

- A share of your estate After you have provided for your loved ones, you can leave a share of what remains to charity. This is known as a residuary gift.
- A cash gift This is when you leave an exact sum of money to us. This is known as a pecuniary gift.
- A specific gift This can be anything from a musical instrument to antique jewellery.

# Send us a pledge form

If you have included Framlingham College in your Will, or intend to do so, we would be grateful if you could complete a pledge form. This is not legally binding, but it will help with the College's long-term planning. Importantly, it will also enable us to thank you properly for your gift during your lifetime.

### Inform your solicitor

If this is your first Will, your solicitor can express your wishes in a paragraph in your will. If you already have a Will, your solicitor can update it by codicil.


# Confirmation and recognition

#### THE IMPACT OF RECENT LEGACIES | THE FOWLER PAVILION







Funding for the Fowler Pavilion is largely thanks to a substantial legacy bestowed to Framlingham College from the estate of Yela Fowler. Yela made the donation in loving memory of her late husband, Derek Fowler (G1935-40), through the Society of Old Framlinghamians.

A multi-use function room is a key element of the new pavilion. The space offers spectators excellent views over the cricket and hockey pitches, and is ideal for presentations, lectures and other educational purposes. The new pavilion contains a kitchen and serving area, allowing for the College to provide catering in support of matches, tournaments and other events.

The new pavilion boasts aditional changing rooms available for outdoor sports and supplements those used for indoor sports. The existing car parking arrangements, at the nearby Framlingham College Sports Centre and hockey pitch car parks, remain available to people coming to the new building.

# ATHLONE HALL, THE HEADMASTER PORTER THEATRE

Walter Stanley Porter was the Headmaster at Framlingham College from 1955 until 1971. Walter left a substantial legacy that enabled the tired Athlone Hall to be completely transformed into the impressive, modern-day Headmaster Porter Theatre in 2006.





The theatre now boasts raised and collapsible seating, a large versatile stage area, backstage storage areas, a welcoming foyer complete with a bar, and a state-of-the-art computerised sound and lighting system. Refurbishment spilled over into the music department creating sound booths, wide corridors, a lift and well-designed rehearsal spaces.
