After a successful 15s season, we had high expectations for rugby 7s. Our first tournament took us to Oundle for the Northampton Saints 7s, where we faced some tough opponents such as St Joseph's College Ipswich (L19 - 26), Bishops Stortford High School (W 52 - 0) and our local rivals, RHS (W 24 - 19). We placed 2nd in our group and moved on to play Samuel Whitbread Academy where we put in a strong performance, leading at half-time but losing in the final few minutes 21 - 35.

Our next tournament was the New Hall 7s where we travelled down to Chelmsford and made it to the cup final placing 2nd to a strong Finborough side. At Oakham, we had some tough opponents like Denstone College, Stamford and St Edward's, Oxford where we made a lot of improvements leading into the first ever Framlingham College 7s tournament. This, for many, was the highlight of the season.

Framlingham had two teams playing, consisting of many Stradbroke boys. The Alberts won the Bowl competition and the 1sts losing out narrowly in the plate final.
